

I remember the day during our first week of class when we were informed about our semester (学期) project of volunteering at a non-profit organization. When the teacher introduced us to the different organizations that needed our help,my last choice was Operation Iraqi Children (OIC). My first impression of the organization was that it was not going to make enough of a difference with the plans I had in mind.

Then, an OIC representative gave us some details, which somewhat interested me. After doing some research, I believed that we could really do something for those kids. When I went online to the OIC website, I saw pictures of the Iraqi children. Their faces were so powerful in sending a message of their despair (绝望) and need that I joined this project without hesitation. We decided to collect as many school supplies as possible, and make them into kits—one kit, one child.

The most rewarding day for our group was project day, when all the efforts we put into collecting the items finally came together. When I saw the various supplies we had collected, it hit me that every kit we were to build that day would eventually be in the hands of an Iraqi child. Over the past four months, I had never imagined how I would feel once our project was completed. While making the kits, I realized that I had lost sight of the true meaning behind it. I had only focused on the fact that it was another school project and one I wanted to get a good grade on. When the kits were completed, and ready to be sent overseas, the warm feeling I had was one I would never forget.

Hundreds of scientists, writers and academics sounded a warning to humanity in an open letter published last December: Policymakers and the rest of us must engage openly with the risk of global collapse. Researchers in many areas have projected the widespread collapse as "a credible scenario (情景) this century".

A survey of scientists found that extreme weather events, food insecurity, and freshwater shortages might create global collapse. Of course, if you are a non-human species, collapse is well underway.

一项科学家调查发现,极端天气事件、食品不安全和淡水短缺可能导致全球崩溃。当然,如果你 是一种非人类物种,那么崩溃早已在进行中。

The call for public engagement with the unthinkable is especially germane in this moment of still-uncontrolled pandemic and economic crises in the world's most technologically advanced nations. Not very long ago, it was also unthinkable that a virus would shut down nations and that safety nets would be proven so disastrously lacking in flexibility.

The international scholars' warning letter doesn't say exactly what collapse will look like or when it might happen. Collapseology, the study of collapse, is more concerned with identifying trends and with them the dangers of everyday civilization. Among the signatories (签署者) of the warning was Bob Johnson, the originator of the "ecological footprint" concept, which measures the total amount of environmental input needed to maintain a given lifestyle. With the current footprint of humanity, "it seems that global collapse is certain to happen in some form, possibly within a decade, certainly within this century, "Johnson said in an email.

Only if we discuss the consequences of our biophysical limits, the December warning letter says, can we have the hope to reduce their speed, severity and harm. And yet messengers of the coming disturbance are likely to be ignored. We all want to hope things will turn out

fine. As a poet wrote,

The hundreds of scholars who signed the letter are intent (执着) on quieting hope that ignores preparedness. "Let's look directly into the issue of collapse, "hey say, "and deal with the terrible possibilities of what we see there to make the best of a troubling future." 签署这封信的数百名学者致力于沉默那种忽视准备的希望,"让我们直面崩溃的问题",他们说,"处理我们在那里看到的可怕可能性,以便在纠结的未来中尽力做到最好"。

Early fifth-century philosopher St. Augustine famously wrote that he knew what time was unless someone asked him. Albert Einstein added another wrinkle when he theorized that time varies depending on where you measure it. Today's state-of-the-art atomic (原子的) clocks have proven Einstein right. Even advanced physics can't decisively tell us what time is, because the answer depends on the question you're asking.

Forget about time as an absolute. What if, instead of considering time in terms of astronomy, we related time to ecology? What if we allowed environmental conditions to set the tempo (节奏) of human life? We're increasingly aware of the fact that we can't control Earth systems with engineering alone, and realizing that we need to moderate (调节) our actions if we hope to live in balance. What if our definition of time reflected that?

Recently, I conceptualized a new approach to timekeeping that's connected to circumstances on our planet, conditions that might change as a result of global warming. We're now building a clock at the Anchorage Museum that reflects the total flow of several major Alaskan rivers, which are sensitive to local and global environmental changes. We've programmed it to match an atomic clock if the waterways continue to flow at their present rate. If the rivers run faster in the future on average, the clock will get ahead of standard time. If they run slower, you'll see the opposite effect.

最近,我构想了一种新的与我们星球上的情况相关的时间测量方法,这些情况可能会因全球变暖 而发生变化。我们目前正在安克雷奇博物馆建造一座时钟,这座时钟反映了几条关键的阿拉斯加 河流的总流量,这些河流对当地和全球环境变化很敏感。如果河流继续以其目前的速度流动,我 们已经将其编程与原子钟保持同步。如果未来这些河流的平均流速加快,时钟将超前于标准时 间。如果它们流速变慢,你将看到相反的效果。

The clock registers both short-term irregularities and long-term trends in river dynamics. It's a sort of observatory that reveals how the rivers are behaving from their own temporal frame (时间框架), and allows us to witness those changes on our smartwatches or phones. Anyone who opts to go on Alaska Mean River Time will live in harmony with the planet. Anyone who considers river time in relation to atomic time will encounter a major imbalance and may be motivated to counteract it by consuming less fuel or supporting greener policies.

时钟记录了河流动态的短期不规律性和长期趋势。它是一种观测站,展示了河流在自己的时间框架内的行为,并允许我们在我们的智能手表或手机上见证这些变化。任何选择进入阿拉斯加平均河流时间的人将与地球和谐相处。任何将河流时间与原子时间联系起来的人将遭遇重大失衡,并可能会被激励通过减少燃料消耗或支持更环保的政策来对抗这种失衡。

Even if this method of timekeeping is novel in its particulars, early agricultural societies also connected time to natural phenomena. In pre-Classical Greece, for instance, people"corrected"official calendars by shifting dates forward or backward to reflect the change of season. Temporal connection to the environment was vital to their survival. Likewise, river time and other timekeeping systems we're developing may encourage environmental awareness.

When St. Augustine admitted his inability to define time, he highlighted one of time 's most noticeable qualities: Time becomes meaningful only in a defined context. Any timekeeping system is valid, and each is as praiseworthy as its purpose.

Cumbria, England It was an extremely cold winter's evening and freezing fog hung in the air. I climbed to the top of a small rise and realised that the mist was little more than a few feet deep, and though it was only a short climb, I found myself completely above it and looking at a wonderfully clear view of Skiddaw with the sum setting in the west. I used classical techniques, translated from my college days spent in the darkroom into Photoshop, to achieve the black—and—white image (图像).

Port Lympne Reserve, which runs a breeding (繁育) programme, has welcomed the arrival of a rare black rhino calf (犀牛幼息). When the tiny creature arrived on January 31. she became the 40th black rhino to be born at the reserve. And officials at Port Lympne were delighted with the new arrival, especially as black rhinos are known for being difficult to breed in captivity (圏养).

波特林恩野生动物园运营着一个繁育计划,欢迎一只罕见的黑犀牛幼崽的到来。这只小动物在1月31日抵达时成为该野生动物园的第40只黑犀牛幼崽。波特林恩的官员对这个新成员感到非常高兴,尤其是因为众所周知,黑犀牛在圈养中很难繁育。

Paul Beer, head of rhino section at Port Lympne, said: "Obviously we're all absolutely delighted to welcome another calf to our black rhino family. She's healthy, strong and already eager to play and explore. Her mother, Solio, is a first—time mum and she is doing a fantastic job. It's still a little too cold for them to go out into the open, but as soon as the weather warms up. I have no doubt that the little one will be out and about exploring and playing every day." 波特林恩野生动物园犀牛部门主管保罗•比尔说:"显然,我们都非常高兴欢迎另一只犀牛幼崽加入我们的黑犀牛家族。她很健康、很强壮,已经渴望玩耍和探索。她的母亲索利奥是一个头胎妈妈,她做得非常出色。现在天气还有点冷,所以它们还不能到户外去,但一旦天气变暖,我毫不怀疑这个小家伙会每天出去探索和玩耍。"

The adorable female calf is the second black rhino born this year at the reserve, but it is too early to tell if the calves will make good candidates to be returned to protected areas of the wild. The first rhino to be born at Port Lympne arrived on January 5 to first—time mother Kisima and weighed about 32 kg. His mother, grandmother and great grandmother were all born at the reserve and still live there.

这只可爱的雌性幼崽是今年在该野生动物园出生的第二只黑犀牛,但现在还为时过早判断这些幼崽是否适合被送回到野外的受保护区。在波特林恩出生的第一只犀牛是1月5日出生的,由头胎母亲基西玛抚养,体重约32千克。他的母亲、祖母和曾祖母都在野生动物园出生并仍在那里生活。According to the World Wildlife Fund, the global black rhino population has dropped as low as 5500, giving the rhinos a "critically endangered" status.

When I was 9, we packed up our home in Los Angeles and arrived at Heathrow, London on a gray January morning. Everyone in the family settled quickly into the city except me. Without my beloved beaches and endless blue—sky days, I felt at a loss and out of place. Until I made a discovery.

Southbank, at an eastern bend in the Thames, is the center of British skateboarding, where the continuous crashing of skateboards left your head ringing. I loved it. I soon made friends with the local skaters. We spoke our own language. And my favorite: Safe. Safe meant cool. It meant hello. It meant don't worry about it. Once, when trying a certain trick on the beam (横杆), I fell onto the stones, damaging a nerve in my hand, and Toby came over, helping me up: Safe, man. Safe. A few minutes later, when I landed the trick, my friends beat their boards loud, shouting: "Safe! Safe! Safe!" When I was 15, my family moved to Washington. I tried skateboarding there, but the locals were far less welcoming. Within a couple of years, I'd given it up.

"I was a local here 20 years ago," I told him. Then, slowly, he began to nod his head. "Safe, man. Who is a genius? This question has greatly interested humankind for centuries. "谁是天才?"这个问题几个世纪以来一直让人们很感兴趣。

Let's state clearly: Einstein was a genius. His face is almost the international symbol for genius. But we want to go beyond one man and explore the nature of genius itself. Why is it that some people are so much more intelligent or creative than the rest of us? And who are they? 让我们明确一点:爱因斯坦是个天才。他的面孔几乎是天才的国际象征。但我们想要超越一个人,探讨天才本身的本质。为什么有些人比我们其他人更聪明或更有创造力?他们是谁?

In the sciences and arts, those praised as geniuses were most often white men, of European origin. Perhaps this is not a surprise. It's said that history is written by the victors, and those victors set the standards for admission to the genius club. When contributions were made by geniuses outside the club—women, or people of a different color or belief—they were unacknowledged and rejected by others.

A Swedish Professor at Natural History came out to the farm to ask me for help. He had come to Africa to find out at what stage of the embryo( 胎) state the foot of the monkeys begins to differ from the human foot. For this purpose he meant to go and shoot Colobus monkeys on Mount Elgon.
